

Final tower crane comes down at Devon Energy Center in Oklahoma City

The final tower crane at Devon Energy Center disappears from the Oklahoma City downtown skyline as the headquarters nears completion.

The last tower crane at Devon Energy Center is disappearing from the downtown skyline as the headquarters nears completion.

At the height of construction, four tower cranes were used on the 50-story building, the tallest in Oklahoma.

The first employees are set to move into the headquarters next month with various departments set to continue moving into the new offices through summer.

Continental update

Continental Resources Inc., meanwhile, is set to start moving from its home in Enid and into the current Devon headquarters at 20 N Broadway.

The company received approval from the Downtown Design Review Committee this week to place its name atop the 19-story building.

When both companies complete their moves this year, about 2,000 people will be working at the new Devon Energy Center while a workforce of about 300 with Continental Resources will fill the vacated space at 20 N Broadway.
